#### 1. Further discussion on project plan progress

- Other trails also need repairs, eg. Thulo Syabru
- National park / department wants to charge a royalty on fallen timber
  - Need for increased transparency in Langtang Committee financial system
    - Committee currently has approx. \$80,000 from many individual sources
    - Should provide list of donors and crowdfunding sources for funds
    - Current daily costs: approx. 75,000 Rps
    - Finjo Lupchan is treasurer
    - Split training should be planned with OM Nepal and Rasuwa Relief to do some basic finance training
  - DDRC (district disaster relief center)
    - should be asked for special permission to start transporting materials

# 2. Formation of technical working group

- Technical group will meet separately to discuss and revise building plans

- KTM universty has a PPT about rebuilding Langtang (NOT GOOD!!!)
  - they should be contacted
- Temba will send digital file of building plans

# 3. Coordination of Vocational training

- Engineers without borders has a campus on the north side of KTM
  - Possible training support available
  - Austin Lord will contact them
  - Dwarika hotel expressed interest in training
- Ohm from Solidarity Langtang (partner organization with Rasuwa Relief) will eventually do guide training for 15 people to help reestablish tourism
- 4. Data collection / additional organizations' roles and involvement

- Asia Onlus has an assessment sheet of data
  - Karuna foundation: support for health post (Isabella will send more info)
    - already doing health posts and building temporary shelters in Rasuwa
- Langtang Valley Health ran health post in Langtang and raised money (ca \$80,000) for recovery
  - conducted a health survey
  - decided to discontinue Organization and gave all raised money to sustainable steps
  - contact: Gyanaan (in canada, can be contacted via their homepage)
- Sustainable steps
  - built hanger things
  - doing sponsorships with all Langtang children
  - probably have Langtang data
  - Contact: Amit Shapira (#9803948074)

# 5. Possible contribution to project by group

- Rasuwa relief has another 8 solar units at hand and another 15 that can be ordered
- Langtang Committee does list of concerns
- Asia Onlus can possibly support temporary shelter as well as the restocking of the animals and livestock
  - Mules are better for transport because of the thin trail
  - Approx. 30 mules are needed for transport
- German Caritas will likely be working on trails and is coordinating with the National Park
  - DAV (German alpinist club) also expressed interest in helping with trail
